

2021: Working remotely while risk of COVID was high in Alameda County



2023: Peralta Colleges campuses are back in person with low risk of COVID, and COVID block grant money used to waive student fees this fall

2021: Had not yet completed Phase 1 move to PeopleSoft version 9.2



2023: Now working on Phase 3 Campus Solutions/ student enrollment project. Phase 1 completed Oct 2021 and Phase 2 launch of Finance and Human Resources modules completed April 2022






Redistricting: New Trustee Territories

Every ten years, local governments use new census data to redraw their district lines to reflect how local populations have changed. Federal and state law requires Community College Districts to engage communities in the redistricting process by holding public hearings and doing public outreach, including to non-English-speaking communities. After a thorough review process, the Peralta CCD Board of Trustees adopted redrawn districts at their February 22, 2022, meeting.





- College EMPs were used to inform the draft District Strategic Plan Spring 2023 – Fall 2028. The Board had the second read of the District Strategic Plan during their July 27, 2023, Retreat, and will vote to approve in September.

Return To Campus

- Masks are **OPTIONAL** with two exceptions:
 - Faculty may require masks in the classroom if that requirement was in the syllabus
 - Employees with personal office spaces can require visitors to mask up within those spaces
- While our vaccination policy is unchanged, we are no longer expending resources on enforcing the policy.
 - We are not asking students to upload their proof of vaccination
 - Vaccination status will soon be removed from class rosters



Fiscal Overview and FY2023-24 Budget




Fiscal Challenges

- Projected General Fund expenses (Drivers – OPEB Bond payment, Bad debt, Property Ins., DSPS, PRS/STRS, step/column, health benefits) exceed projected revenues
- Estimated savings from benefit vendor change did not produce the \$3.5M in savings to the GF (Retiree savings accrue to fund 94 not 1);
- No HEERF revenues to help offset expense budget
- More than 5-year decline in FTES (enrollment)
- Changes in provisions of the Student-Centered Funding Formula (End of Hold Harmless & Pandemic Emergency Condition Allowance and a new funding floor)
- Funded above our earned enrollment (FTES) [15,524 vs. 13,274]



6-Year FTES Trend



6 Year Trend Revenue & Expense Budgets Per FTES





\$151 Million Bond Sale

- Sale closing was announced during the Peralta Charrette on November 10, 2022
- The sale included \$120 Million of General Obligation (GO) new money bonds that will fund voter-approved infrastructure improvements at PCCD's four colleges and \$31 Million of GO refunding bonds to refinance bonds issued in 2012
- The refinancing will save taxpayers approximately \$1.5 Million

Bond Measures Oversight Committee






