## BCC Welcomes Third Community Health Worker Apprenticeship Cohort



On Thursday, January 8, Berkeley City College welcomed 14 new apprentices to its Community Health Worker Apprentice Workshop. This orientation marked the launch of their program's third cohort and provided apprentices with opportunities to connect with their peers, instructors, counselors, and college support staff.

Kristen Kitts, East Bay Innovations Apprentice Success Coach, presented an overview of the 4 components of the CHW apprenticeship: classroom instruction, on-the-job training, progressive wages, and a transferable credential. Apprentices learned about their required, tuition-free coursework sequence, which runs through completion in Spring 2027.
