



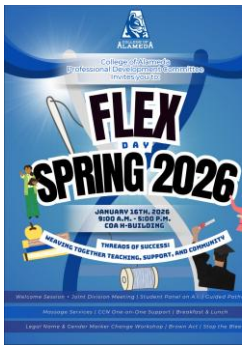
President's Report to the PCCD Board of Trustees
