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Laney ECT Students Tour Davies Symphony Hall



Students from Laney College's Environmental Control Technology (ECT) program participated in a behind-the-scenes tour of San Francisco's Davies Symphony Hall this semester, gaining firsthand insight into large-scale commercial HVAC systems. The trip was sponsored by Johnson Controls in partnership with Local 39 and aligned with ECT coursework.

Led by the venue's engineering team, the visit included access to mechanical rooms, control centers, and energy systems supporting the landmark facility. Organized by ECT Department Chair Sappho Su, the experience gave students a real-world perspective on the systems they study in class.

Students described the trip as both educational and inspiring, reinforcing Laney's commitment to hands-on learning and industry preparation.
